This book marks the historic remake of one of the finest architectural works of Frank Lloyd Wright which has a prominent world reputation. I transformed a rough 1947 build into the home it was meant to be. This book is that story.

In the spring of 1982, needing a quick place to live, I moved into this deserted and unlivable home. It had been sitting empty and without any heat but the solar for two years. I was recently out of college working in a new R&D group as their computer expert. With a deep understanding of the issues with the house from 20 years of history, I decided to purchase the house and bring it back to life. I knew where all the bodies were buried.

I kept detailed photo records and after retiring from the University at the end of 2019, started the process of writing the story of the second stage in the house's history. I42 of the restored films are included. Within the book I dropped 400 and 500 pixel placeholders for real pictures to be placed. All of the images were restored at 300 DPI and cleaned using the German software SilverFast. I have not cut up the images which at full size are close to $8" \times 10"$ but plan to work with the publisher as needed.

The contents list is a bit more than usual perhaps. This is mostly due to the historical nature of the home and restoration.
